Connecting data and systems

Members are identified using proprietary medical, behavioral, and pharmacy data and advanced analytics.

Pharmacists act as a nexus for at-risk members in navigating the complexity of their health care.

Clinical connections and expertise

The pharmacist coordinates with the patient and their providers to assess patient's holistic needs and optimize the medication regimen, supporting achievement of the patient's health-related goals and improvement in clinical outcomes.
